


Caring was essential now more than ever

- The campus recognized the value a focus of care especially during the pandemic
- People felt disconnected
- Conducted a student withdrawal survey (5429 students)
- Focused on goals and activities based on what our students and the college were experiencing during COVID
- Shaped projects based on our students' situation and what they needed.



Caring was essential now more than ever





- Developed a directory because of our remote environment
- Students needed something that would allow them to connect to the right resource or service.
- Needed to be user friendly and accessible



- The police was one of the few departments that stayed on campus. They were often the first if not the only contact for students on campus.
- The Chief of Police had a vision that aligned with Caring Campus.
- Redefine the police image and roll for students


Since the Caring Campus Workgroup convened in February 2021, the following efforts have been finalized:

- Slogan, Logo designed by the Public Affairs team to brand Caring Campus!
- Support Materials, Toolkit, & Website also designed by Public Affairs team to serve as a resource for campus
 partners to incorporate into their websites and onboarding materials. (Our Police Chief is an amazing
 ambassador).
- Functional Resource Directory a tool for facilitating warm handoffs and memorable referrals for students.
- Top-5 Guide a resource for all employees to maintain a helpful, campus-wide knowledge base, regardless of what department they work in.



Early Accomplishments




December 2018

- Find opportunities to recreate community





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






During the pandemic, the MendoCares team implemented the following:


Virtual Departmental Open Houses
